During that time we had grown close to so many people at Westwood, particularly our Home Group. With the picture of Jonah in mind, and desiring to avoid a similar fate, we moved this fall.

God's plan is perfect and we're excited to be in the middle of His will. In September I began serving as Executive Pastor of Park Hill Baptist Church in North Little Rock. The main tasks involved with that role include working with the Senior Pastor to oversee the entire ministry, staff and finances of the church. I was the final piece of an entirely new staff here over the last 3-4 years. They are a great group of folks and fun to work with. Most of the former staff retired after long tenures here.

My first Sunday here followed the Alabama-Arkansas game. I kept quiet the entire morning, until at a newcomer's lunch the pastor's wife asked me why Alabama "didn't know who they were" and had two mascots. I told her, "I didn't know about the elephant, but hog's blood is what makes the tide crimson."

Andy is enrolled at Alabama, but as part of a Mechanical Engineering Co-op is working this fall semester at a Tiffin Motor Home Plant in Red Bay, Alabama. He will be returning to Tuscaloosa by Christmas. It

was difficult for us to move further from Andy, but it is comforting to know he has friends and a church family there at Capstone Church in case there is some crisis (that we parents create in our heads).

In July my mom passed away. Although it was difficult to let her go, she had been suffering from Parkinson's Disease for a number of years and was ready. In some ways I felt more freedom to move after she passed. I am so thankful for both her and my dad and their investment in my life.







The tornados that swept through in late April impacted us all in some way. Andy was in school at Tuscaloosa. On the afternoon of April 27, I answered a call from Liz. Her distressed and tearful voice simply reported, "I'm watching a tornado rip through Tuscaloosa on live TV and I can't reach Andy." I headed home, avoiding the urge to drive to Tuscaloosa with my disaster relief credentials. We were able to reach him about an hour after the disaster. The tornado's path was just a few hundred yards from his apartment. In the following weeks, all four of us had the opportunity to work in disaster relief. Liz did some trips to Ecuador this summer as part of her work as a missionary with E3 Partners. The trips were to Macas and Ibarra with members from Westwood, Calera, Sunrise and Moulton Baptist Churches. It is exciting to see God work on those trips which involve winning people to Christ and planting churches, beginning with a small home church.
